Board Report

Susie Ball presented the CAC's concerns regarding Mountaire to the Board. Ball appointed an ad hoc committee of the Board to look into the issues at Mountaire as they pertain the CCMP of the Inland Bays.

The Board supported the Clean Water Bill. Sec Garvin had reservations about the method of funding.

Mountaire Update

The Committee met twice. Its purpose was focused on advising the Center as to the outreach actions the Center should take to address the violations. Policy level recommendations were made. A plan was developed to educate residents in the area on the health of the river. Our recommendations will focus on mitigation of the nitrogen levels going into the river. Also make recommendations to prevent this from happening again.

In doing the research an EPA order was found that Mountaire was ordered to reduce nitrogen level in aquifer to safe drinking standard o concerns are how to prevent this from happening again.

Discussion ensued by the committee as to the severity of the mountain pollution.

John Austin gave a presentation on other areas in the county where there is drinking water contamination.
